



## Eastern Conference Finals

**56-31 Havlicek Division Champions Mount Dora Hurricanes**

**vs**

**69-19 Robertson Division Champions Callaway Kings**

**Regular Season:** The Callaway Kings had the league's 2<sup>nd</sup> best offense (127.6) and finished with the 2<sup>nd</sup> best record of 65-17. Terry Cummings led the league with a 28.9 scoring average and topped the team with 8.8 boards per game. James Edwards (16.8), Andrew Toney (16.1) and Norm Nixon (15.5) were the others scoring 15+. Nixon was 5<sup>th</sup> in the league with 9.1 assists. The Hurricanes made a big off-season move, sending defensive standout Michael Cooper to Sun Valley for the high-flying Darrell Griffith. Dr. Dunkenstein finished with the team's 3<sup>rd</sup> best average of 17.2 points. He also made 87-205 treys for a .424 percentage, 2<sup>nd</sup> only to World B. Free's .480 clip. Kevin McHale led the team with 19.4 ppg. Jack Sikma scored at a 17.3 rate and topped the team in rebounds with a 9.2 average. The Kings led the league with a .546 FG%. The 'Canes shot .495. CWK had a 10.0 scoring differential, while MDH's was 2.5.



**Playoffs:** Callaway matched up with division rival Oklahoma for the 3<sup>rd</sup> straight year in round 1 (4<sup>th</sup> time overall). The Kings won in 6 behind Cummings' 26.0 points and 7.5 rebounds. Thanks to a couple blowouts, the Kings had an amazing 9 players average 10 or more points. The Hurricanes had a tougher time, winning in 5. They had a one-point win, a two-point win and two by seven points. Their lone loss was by 18 points, so they were actually outscored by one point for the 5-game matchup. Sikma was limited to 3 games, but made it count when he played, averaging team-highs of 22.7 points and 8.3 boards. McHale was 2<sup>nd</sup> with 17.0 and 8.2 respectively.

**Head-to-head:** Callaway took 6 of the 9 head-to-head games. Against the Hurricanes, Cummings scored 40+ three times, averaging 29.6 points and 9.9 rebounds. The Kings held McHale to 16.0 points and Sikma to 14.8. Griffith picked up a little bit of the slack, averaging 20.2 per contest.
